GENERAL CONFERENCE 2024 SUMMARY

After years of intensive and prayerful debate, General Conference delegates from all over the world voted to remove language that prohibited United Methodist clergy from performing weddings for same-gender couples. This change allows churches and clergy to operate according to their conscience and follow the leading of the Spirit in their context. Pastors have always decided who they will marry and will continue to do so. Churches will continue to determine what weddings are held in their buildings. Pastors are asked to respect the decisions made by their local church. District Superintendents are available to assist with working through these decisions and their implications.

The delegates of the General Conference also voted to remove prohibitions that prevented a Board of Ordained Ministry from recommending LGBTQIA+ persons for ordination. Now, all persons may enter the process to become candidates for ministry, and if approved by the Board of Ordained Ministry, can now be licensed, commissioned, and ordained. The Bishop and Cabinet will continue to work with churches and clergy to ensure the best match possible when making appointments. To safeguard clergy, delegates also passed legislation to make crossconference appointments possibly if there isn't a safe appointment in the home conference for LGBTQIA+ clergy.

Annual conferences will pay lower annual apportionments over the next quadrennium. Delegates voted to reduce a key component of calculating apportionments, shifting from the current base rate of 3.29% to a base rate of 2.6% for 2025 and 2026. If the apportionment collection rate is 90% or higher in those years, the base rate will jump to 2.9% for 2027 and 2028. The Bishops may call a special General Conference Session in 2026 to evaluate financial realities in the wake of disaffiliations and adjust budget & apportionment percentages as needed.

General Conference delegates approved the Compass Plan, which switches clergy retirement accounts from defined benefit plans to defined contribution plans. It gives clergy more control of their retirement funds, but removes some of the safeguards intended to ensure clergy have enough to retire. Wespath will continue to offer support, training, and care to clergy and their families. Petitions on the worldwide regionalization plan were affirmed by the General Conference. This is a multi-step plan that requires an aggregate vote of the annual conferences around the world. The work has just begun on a time of information sharing and education about regionalization so that annual conference members can make an informed vote at the 2025 annual conference.

Delegates approved full communion with the Episcopal Church. This agreement needs the approval by the Episcopalians before going into effect, which might not happen until they meet in 2027. This means that the two denominations recognize each other as "one, holy, catholic and apostolic church in which the Gospel is rightly preached and taught." In specific cases, it may enable clergy to serve in both denominations interchangeably.

Based on a growing understanding that sacramental authority in scripture is granted with all ordinations, General Conference delegates passed new legislation granting authority to deacons to preside at the sacraments in their ministry settings. This means deacons can now offer communion and conduct baptisms where they have been appointed to serve, whether that is a church, outreach ministry or mission.
