¹ Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. ² He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. ³ In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, 'Grant me justice against my accuser.' ⁴ For a while he refused, but later he said to himself, 'Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, 5 yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming." And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. 7 And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? 8 I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" ⁹ He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: 10 "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ¹² I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' ¹³ But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' ¹⁴ I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other, for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

Imagine our community with enough food resources to provide every man, woman and child with good nutritious food and a full tummy.

Saginaw First United does its part to address food scarcity in our community. During the school year, we work with Saginaw Township schools to provide weekend food support for 22 students at Westdale Elementary and 31 students at Arrowwood Elementary. This nearly \$8,000 annual investment in local children and families, is not a line item in our annual budget. It is supported by the generosity of members like you, over and above our pledges. We receive food at a great markdown through the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan in Flint, which makes this program possible.

Our monthly, free community dinner welcomes 50-75 neighbors. Sometimes more! It's an opportunity to share a nutritious and filling meal, make personal connections with new people, and warmly welcome them into our safe community space. This monthly dinner has a small, supplemental budget aimed at purchasing items that aren't donated by church members. Each meal is funded, prepared and served by generous members. Since moving into our building, the PFLAG group has funded two dinners per year which has helped us stay in budget.

Food donations to the pantry at New Heart Church help ensure that others have the food basics that most of us take for granted. Saginaw First United also partners with the East Side Soup Kitchen, offering food and financial support and volunteering our time. We also occasionally donate leftover food from Free Community Meals or other events to Old Town Soup Kitchen.

We also provide funding for one meal annually for students involved in campus ministry at CMU and U of M.

There are many organizations and agencies in Saginaw that work hard every day to address food scarcity. Through our annual stewardship support, we have the opportunity to make an even more significant impact!

Our 2026 annual Stewardship campaign is focused on:


