Christmas Eve: Altogether Faithful

- R1: In the summer of 1741, John Wesley Preached a sermon entitled "The Almost Christian", which drew distinction between "the almost Christian" who has an outward appearance of godliness but little depth, and "the altogether Christian" whose deep inward conviction to love God and neighbor with their whole being is lived daily in thought, word, and action.
- All: In Advent and beyond, we seek to grow into altogether Christians. We come to worship this Christmas Eve to cultivate altogether faithfulness within our spirits.
- R2: On this night, light came into the world, and the darkness could not overcome it. In an out-of-the-way place, in a cave meant for animals, in a time when oppression was national policy and anxiety coursed through every community, God came into the world. Utterly vulnerable, the infant Jesus embodied the life-giving presence of Emmanuel, God-With-Us. He came to lead us beyond almost peace, almost hope, almost love, and almost joy, into an altogether faith that infuses the depth of our being with light. For by grace, we have been saved through faith, and this is not our own doing. It is the gift of God.
- All: To all who receive him, who believe in his name, he gives power to become children of God, born not of blood, flesh or will, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth. [John 1:12-14]
- R3: We light all the candles on the Advent Wreath tonight, beginning with the candles of Peace, Hope, Love, and Joy. Finally, we light the Christ candle at the center of the wreath, for Christ is the center of our church, the center of our faith, the center of our very being.
- All: Come, Lord Jesus, be born in us this night. Though you are beyond all scope of human imagination, give us grace to hold you close, even as you hold us in your grace. Transform us from almost Christians into altogether Christians, that we may be born again in your spirit and reflect your light that no darkness can overtake, for we ask in Jesus' holy name. Amen.
