**Joined First U.M.C. in February 1960
Celebrating 66 years of membership.**

Rita Taylor was raised in the Auburn United Methodist Church. She and her late husband, Jerry, were married at her parents' home. At the time, Rita had a good office job at the former Seitner's Department Store in downtown Saginaw. But duty called, Jerry entered the Army and off they went to Columbus, GA. While there, they often

worshipped at the Methodist Church across the street from their apartment. As Jerry's time of service was winding down, Rita received a telegram from the folks at Seitner's wondering when she was coming back. So, after leaving Georgia they returned to Saginaw, and soon after decided it was time to settle down and start a family. They also started 'church shopping.' In 1960 they visited First Methodist Church, liked it and stayed. Rita recalls the many activities and social groups that were available at that time, as well as lots of people their age. Current member, Edna Blaisdell, and former First United members, Marilyn and Rudy Neuendorf (now in Florida), became long-time friends. Both Rita and Jerry were on the church bowling team for many years. Jerry served as an usher for more than 60 years and participated in the Men's Club. Rita became involved with United Methodist Women that has evolved into Rebecca Fellowship. Both of them were very active with the church rummage sales, the Harvest dinners, and helping with the annual pasty sale. Rita served as a Sunday school teacher and was a regular volunteer with the former Food Pantry at St. Peter & Paul Church. And for years she assembled holiday food baskets for First U.M.C. members in need. Jerry passed away in 2025. When she reflects on her 66 years of membership, Rita is most grateful for all the friends who have shared the journey. As she put it, 'I have some alive and a lot of them have moved; and some are waiting up in heaven. The church has been good to me.'



“Restored” by Tom Berlin



